"Sioux and Chippewa Peace Treaty of 1870." Inkpa used pictographic images and ledger paper form the 1860-1905 to tell the story of the Sweet Corn Treaty. Each symbol represents a key historical event that lead to the signing of the Sweet Corn Treaty between the (Sioux) Isanti Dakota and (Chippewa) Anisinaabe. This treaty led to lasting peace between both northern tribes.

Welcowe to the New Giiwedinong Treaty Rights & Culture Museum

In October of 2023, the new Giiwedinong Treaty Rights & Culture Museum showcasing the Anishinaabe Culture, History and Treaties, opened.

Giiwedinong pronounced, "Gee-Way-Den-Ong," is housed in a former Carnegie Library, and represents a claim of the Anishinaabeg history and narrative.

Since Giiwedinong opened, they've served many schools, and community groups with over 300-people at the opening, and, despite the cold winter time, approximately 500-hundred visitors in total over the past 4- months since the opening.

"...Our history is one of land, water, and the people who have taken care of the Manoomin, wild rice and fish for 1000's of years. Our history has not been told by our people, and the specific narrative of peace keeping, treaties and agreements, we focus on, is very important to civil society. Indeed, we share not only treaties between our people and the U.S., but also treaties between Indigenous nations- from the Wampum Belts to the Buffalo treaty..."

Giiwedinong is not just a traditional museum, but a vibrant basket of stories, paintings, artwork and maps that shift and change over time.

Every piece of content in the museum tells a story of social, environmental, and racial justice, inspiring visitors and our broader community to reflect on the past and work together for a better future. The museum's goal is to educate visitors about Anishinaabe culture and history, and to highlight the importance of treaties with other Indigenous nations that protect their future.

Giiwedinong plans to host several cultural events like Procession of the Species, a parade of puppets and animals representing the natural world; and the Annual Días de los Muertos, Day of the Dead, Block Party in October.




Headwaters Center for Lifelong Learning (HCLL) in progress

Following are the programs you won't want to miss:

- March 5: Julie Dickie will share photos and heartwarming stories of dedicated volunteers bringing injured animals back to their natural habitat.

2024 Sculpture Trail...entries are invited

The City of Park Rapids and Park Rapids Arts and Culture Advisory Commission are accepting entries for the Park Rapids Sculpture Trail. Entry deadline is March 22. Artists will be notified of selection committee results by April 3 and will have until May 15 to install their works.

Artists will receive a \$500 honorarium when their works are installed and paperwork is completed. The entry form can be downloaded at www.heartlandarts.org/pages/sculpture-trail.php.

An opening and guided walk of the new installations are planned May 18.

The Sculpture Trail project was initiated in 2018 in Red Bridge Park, providing a beautiful setting on the Fish Hook River. In 2019, the Sculpture Trail expanded to locations in Downtown Park Rapids. The Arts and Culture Commission's intent is to change the sculptures annually to expose visitors to new works.





Saturday April 20: Superstars of STEM 2:00-5:00 p.m. (The Event Room, 1104 Park Ave. South)



Wednesday May 8: Jay Grammond Veteran Memorials of Minnesota 10:30-11:30 a.m.



Auditions will be held at the Armory Arts & Events Center the weekend of **March 21-23**. NLOC's stage director and choreographer will be in Park Rapids from New York City and Minneapolis to conduct the auditions.

Singers, actors and dancers of all ages will have a chance to try out for a role and again connect with friends from past productions. There will also be an opportunity to audition via ZOOM. NLOC's website - **northernlightopera.org** - will have more information.

Lead Roles: Roxie Hart, an aspiring vaudevillian who kills her paramour and is sent to jail (alto); Velma Kelly, a vaudevillian and murderess on trial for killing her cheating husband (alto); Billy Flynn, their lawyer (baritone); Amos, Roxie's husband (baritone); "Mama", the Cook County Jail matron (alto); and Mary Sunshine, the journalist. There will also be numerous roles for dancers and singers who will create this world of jazz, crime and the razzle dazzle of Chicago.

In addition to actors, singers and dancers, NLOC has many opportunities for participation. NLOC has a reputation for presenting quality summer musical theater productions. There are amazing sets to be constructed and painted, costumes to be sewn or altered, and publicity to make our community aware.

Production dates will be **July 23, 27, 28, 31 and August 1, 2 and 3**.
